

two afterward witness told ANN of her bad conduct, for which she expressed deep regret. The thumb became much inflamed, and deceased went to Bellevue Hospital, where she died a short time after.

ANN FOLEY acknowledged that she and deceased had been drinking, and quarreled on the night in question, but she had no recollection of having bitten Mrs. GERRY's thumb; the wound, as she remembers it, did not appear severe. ANN FOLEY was remanded to the care of Capt. CAFFREY until today, when Coroner HERRMAN will conclude the examination.

The Shanty Death Investigation.

Further testimony was taken, yesterday, in the Coroner's investigation of the circumstances attending the death of MARGARET GERRY, who died from the effects of a gangrenous wound said to have been inflicted by ANN FOLEY, with whom she quarreled some time ago. The husband, JOHN GERRY, who resides at No. 408 West Thirty-eighth-street, testified that deceased was in the habit of drinking occasionally. On the night of the 6th of August he went to bed early, and in the morning was told by his wife that ANN FOLEY had got in through the window during the night.
